Oral historians have begun to use interviews in significant ways to supplement what may be described as the more traditional institutional “bricks and mortar” histories of colleges and universities. Many large public universities in the Americas were founded after 1850 and first published their histories at the half-century mark following the beginning of the twentieth century. In many instances, these college histories focused on firsts and founders and gave particular attention to the physical development of the campus and especially the construction of buildings.
